



## About the GMAT

The Graduate Management Admission Test (**GMAT**) is a requirement of most accredited graduate business schools in the United States and Canada. The exam measures your verbal and mathematical reasoning skills. The **GMAT** is divided into four sections: an Analytical Writing section, an Integrated Reasoning section, a Verbal section, and a Quantitative section. The Analytical Writing section always comes first followed by Integrated Reasoning then the two multiple-choice sections.

The **GMAT** is approximately 3.5 hours long and administered via computer. It is probably unlike any other test that you have ever taken. Unlike paper-based tests, you cannot go back or change your answers to previously completed questions on any of the sections. In addition, the multiple choice Quantitative and Verbal sections are in a computer-adaptive format, meaning the difficulty level of each question is based on whether you got the previous question right or wrong.

Your performance on the Verbal and Quantitative sections results in a combined scaled score ranging from **200-800** points. Your performance on the Analytical Writing Assessment results in a separate scaled score ranging from **0.0-6.0** points. Your performance on the Integrated Reasoning section is also reported separately on a scaled score ranging from **1-8**. Your Analytical Writing Assessment and Integrated Reasoning scores do not affect your total GMAT score.
